Congratulations to the 400 girls and their whanau who achieved over 90% attendance in Term 1 AND less than 3 lates. Our expectation is that all students attend school every day, and it is fantastic that students are making a real effort with attendance. There is still some work to do on being on time to school with up to 70 students arriving after 8.40am. We would appreciate whanau making arrangements to get their student to school on time if this is a problem.

No doubt you have heard through the media that the free school lunches are changing from 2025. Our students have been lucky to have been provided a hot meal every day since 2021. While it is unclear at this stage about what will be provided from 2025, we know that hot meals and our caterer will no longer be funded. I have attended a couple of meetings about this and there is a lot more discussion to be had as Principals respond to the Government decision. Hopefully by Term 4 we will know exactly what our students will be receiving each day.

While I am on the topic of food, McAuley High School has a healthy food policy. Part of this policy is that takeaway or fast food and soft drinks such as chips, KFC, McDonalds, Coke are not allowed on site. Please remind your daughter about this. If you drop this type of food off to your daughter, they cannot pick it up until after school.

Last week 15 McAuley students took part in the Pompallier Shield which is a competition between all the Catholic secondary schools in the Auckland Diocese. I extend my congratulations to all these students who represented us with pride, enthusiasm and performed well. A number of other Principals have commented on how lovely our girls were.

The highlight of the year for many seniors, the school ball, is coming up at the end of term. While this is an exciting event, it cannot dominate the term! Students need to be focussed on their school work and completing their assessments as well as maintaining high attendance. Please talk to your daughter to ensure she has her priorities in the right order!

Winter sport has begun and we wish our teams all the best, play hard and play fair, be humble in victory and gracious in defeat. I also remind spectators to follow the same mantra.

These are about to start again for term two and I strongly encourage you to attend as you are presented with relevant information for your daughter's year level, and an opportunity to speak with the dean. Please also take a note of all the other important dates for this term, as usual our calendar is full.

Finally, that you for your unwavering support for your daughters, and for their gift of a McAuley education. We educate amazing young women!
